TheSouthernCrosshas proven to be a safe and seaworthy craft capable of handling all kinds of conditions, be it coastal cruising or ocean passages. She performs equally well in light winds and heavy weather. She is sailed easily by a crew of two and provides comfortable and spacious accommodation for six plus ample deck space for day sailing adventures with friends.

3 generous double cabins and one storage area (or 4 double cabins) each with an ensuite, including two Sitz baths;
